Maryama's Story

Maryama has been able to provide for her children by taking part in a Village Savings and Loan Association, supported by Christian Aid's partner

Maryama is a farmer living in Njualahun village in Sierra Leone. Tragically Maryama's husband died leaving her to support their four children. In recent years, the climate crisis has affected Maryama's crop yield. In addition to working the land, Maryama would harvest groundnuts and extract the oil to sell but even this wasn't enough to make ends meet. She needed to invest in her farming to ensure a secure future for her family but had few options. Maryama found herself taking out loans that were unsustainable for her. As she told Christian Aid, '... there was a lot of challenges ... Repaying loans has been a serious problem.'

Christian Aid's partner WoNES worked with Maryama and her neighbours to help them establish a Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA) in their community. VSLAs empower women like Maryama to take back control of their finances, their farms and their future. They offer a space for training women in leadership skills and economic management. VSLAs enable their members to offer and manage lowinterest loans as a collective. Members also save together. Each VSLA is led by a committee from within the community.

Maryama told Christian Aid:

'[The VSLA] has been a support to me because I have been able to pay my kids' [school] fees. It's a blessing for us ... This will help us support our kids to be educated. When I go to the farm, do my farming, the leadership derived from the VSLA has been a support to me. ... VSLA is an empowerment for us as women. It has helped to bring us together as community members, especially the women, and it's a strength for unity. It's an empowerment for us - every time you don't have to consult somebody to loan you or to give you something. Women should have power and they should be able to take decisions.'

Maryama and her community still face challenges as the impact of the climate crisis grows. Access to water and sanitation remains difficult. But by working with WoNES and developing the VSLA, Maryama and her neighbours now have more options for the future.

Maryama's hope is that **'the Lord [will] provide more'** through the work of WoNES and VSLAs will **'extend to other communities so they can benefit like us.'**
