Prayer of Approach

God of all justice and peace, we cry out to you in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear which prevails in the Holy Land.

Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.

While we pray to you, O Lord, for an end to violence and the establishment of peace, we also call for you to bring justice and equity to the peoples.

Guide us into your kingdom, where all people are treated with dignity and honour as your children, for to all of us you are our Heavenly Father.

In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. We are facing an unbearable situation. We are struggling to keep our strength and hope. We are waiting now to see what the world is going to do for people in Gaza. We feel frustrated and we feel alone. There are so many displaced people hundreds of thousands...and destruction everywhere.

Prayer for Peace

Lord, hear us as we pray for lasting peace.

We thank you for progress towards peace and pray that this crisis will finally end, without further loss of life. We pray for the injured, the suffering and for those who mourn their loved ones. We pray for all people who have been displaced, those who have lost their homes and those returning now to what is left.

Lord, hear us as we pray for a just peace.

We pray for the powerful decision-makers who are acting for peace. May they follow the paths of justice, mercy and compassion. We pray for recognition of the value of human life. We remember that we are all made in the image of God.

Lord, hear us as we pray for permanent peace.

We pray for those who are most vulnerable. We remember your call, Lord, to help the bereaved, the stranger, the orphan. We pray for medical staff and humanitarian workers who continue to serve others, even when they are themselves deeply affected by this conflict. We pray especially for children whose lives have been devastated by violence, that they may know safety.

God of peace and justice, hear our prayers. Amen.

Reflection

He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire. He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Psalm 46:9-10 Psalm 46 talks about waters roaring and mountains quaking, about the noise of violence and war. But it ends with God saying, 'Be still and know that I am God'.

- Invite people to close their eyes as they listen to Psalm 46 being read aloud.
- Begin to pray silently for stillness and for peace in Gaza. Reflect on how the noises of war are slowly falling silent as God makes peace.
- Finish the time of reflection by giving thanks that God will be exalted above all things.

Prayer of Intercession

And to enable that day to come soon, raise up for us prophets who will give us new sight for better seeing. Raise up for us prophets who will spell out that God has no favourite race nor heaven a favoured language.

And if you will not raise up for us prophets then raise up in us that holy restlessness. To listen endlessly, to speak out consistently, and to work tirelessly for your will to be done on earth as it is in Heaven.
